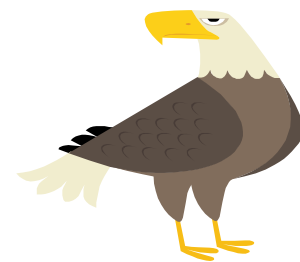

Enrollment Information

Enrollment for the 2019-20 school year has been set for May 2nd from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm at FW. You should receive an enrollment form prior to this date. Check the form to verify that all the information is correct. If you find incorrect data cross out the incorrect areas and make necessary changes. Please write legi-

bly in order for district staff to enter the information correctly. The district will screen incoming kindergarten students. Therefore, current kindergartners **will NOT** report to school on May 2nd so that we may conduct the screenings. If you have a child who will attend kindergarten next school year

bring your child with you on this day. Please bring vaccination records, birth certificate, proof of residence for your kindergartener. A staff member will have your child perform a series of tests. Upon completion of the tests another staff member will review the results with parents.

Over the summer break students typically regress in their knowledge because of lack of learning activities. To help combat this loss, there are several things you can do with your child to help them. Below are some ideas to help them throughout the summer.

ONLINE RESOURCES

The state of Kansas purchased an online program that students can use at home or at school for reading the program is called I station. This program can be downloaded as an app. The students have indicated that the program is engaging. Your child should know

how to logon to this program once you have it downloaded. At the beginning of each month the program is designed to give a placement test to the child and determine the progress the child has made and move them to a new level. To get books online a great resource is getepic.com.

For math, there are several good websites to help with mathematical thinking. The students use Zearn at school, therefore, have a password they can use to log in at home. The site is Zearn.org. Another website to visit is Gregtangmath.com to find engaging problems. An app that your child may like is Mo-

tion Math.

BOB THE BUS

B.O.B. stands for Books on the Bus. This is a converted school bus which travels around the city giving students the opportunity to check out books. The bus runs Monday thru Thursday. Check for upcoming details about stops and times that the bus is at the designated stops.

Setting Goals for a Growth Mindset

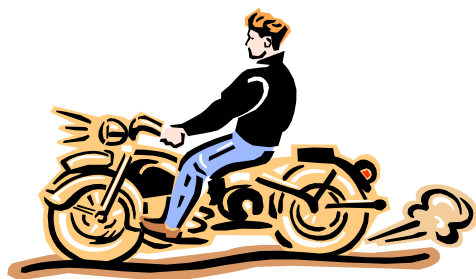
Have a great summer break!
